HOA OFFICE CORNER UPDATES & REMINDERS



<u>URGENT:</u> Please read the Plumbing Notice sent with this newsletter! If you have tenants in your unit, be sure to advise them of this important information.

- A General Board Meeting will be held on December 9th, to include the Board review, voting in the 2026 Budget, and important updates in the community since July's meeting.
- The Annual Owners' Meeting will take place on January 13th.
- Occasionally a dumpster is missed on the regular pickup run. We immediately call in a pickup ASAP. <u>Please do not put your trash into an</u> <u>overflowing dumpster but take it to one nearby which has room</u>. Overflow creates both cleanup & pest problems.
- Recent thefts & vandalism on the property have occurred. Please call the police if you see suspicious or criminal activity. (Do not call the office after hours.)
- The Architectural Improvements form is now available on our website for you to print out. This is required for flooring updates & replacing windows, changes on lanais & on all entry doors.
- Also, we now have an "Application for Sale or Lease" form available on the site which can be completed by typing the information in.
- If you're a new owner or have changed the locks, please be sure the office has a key or entry codes to your unit. This is in Association rules & regulations.

Dear Unit Owners,

As we continue our regular stack cleaning rotation, our plumbers have reported several recurring issues that need to be addressed to prevent costly plumbing problems for both individual units and the Association.

1. Eggshells in the Drains

Please be aware that eggshells should never be put down the sink or garbage disposal.

- Eggshell fragments are hard, sharp, and do not break down easily.
- When processed through a disposal, they become a sand-like grit that settles in the pipes.
- This grit combines grease, soap, and other debris to form thick sludge.
- Over time, this leads to slow drains, clogs, and unnecessary wear on the garbage disposal.
- In multi-unit buildings, this buildup can accumulate in shared drain lines, increasing the risk of blockages that impact several units.

Eggshells must be disposed of in the trash or compost only.

2, Grease Buildup

Pouring cooking grease down the drain is extremely harmful to the plumbing system.

- While grease appears liquid when hot, it hardens as it cools and sticks to the pipe walls.
- This narrowing of the pipes can cause major blockages in both your unit and the shared building lines.

To prevent this, allow grease to cool and solidify, then place it in a container and dispose of it in the trash.

Please note: If the kitchen sink becomes clogged and our plumbers determine the cause is grease or eggshells, the Association may hold the unit owner responsible for the cost of the plumbing repairs.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping maintain the building's plumbing systems and avoiding unnecessary damage and repair costs.
